

BUSINESS NOTES

At the Business Meeting, your Association presented Onarga Academy a \$500.00 check to support the annual Special Dinner for the resident-clients.

On 1 December, your Association sent a monetary donation to Onarga Academy to provide each resident-client a Christmas gift of \$30 cash as along with the following message:

"May this Season's Blessings and Peace live in your heart; know you are never alone, and are loved by those who guide and care for you."

In accordance with the Association By Laws, the members in attendance elected the appointed President, **Mark Hayden** OMS `67, to continue to serve a full term as President; and nominated and elected **Charles Stewart** OMS `67, to serve a full term as Vice President. There were no opposing candidates for these positions, and both votes were unanimous.

New Business:

- 1. A discussion covered the progress on constructing the Memorial Brick walkway and the need to identify a vendor to provide and engrave bricks. Action with Onarga Academy is underway to complete this project.
- 2. The President noted that the memorabilia room contains a plethora of files, yearbooks, photos, trophies, uniform items and paraphernalia, which need to be thoroughly inventoried and catalogued, sorted, categorized, refurbished or, if unserviceable, disposed.
- a. Your leadership is investigating methods to hire expert assistance to help organize these materials in order to streamline a review process that can efficiently account and classify this collection. Membership suggestions and input is solicited.
- b. In conjunction with the Onarga Historical Society, your Association purchased archival portfolio books to protect and display selected OMS photographs.
- c. A member recently returned 16mm film reels that captured OMS sports teams during their winning seasons. An action is underway to determine whether it is feasible to digitize these films, and produce copies for interested members.
- d. The OMS trophy cases were moved from the gymnasium to the Auditorium foyer hallway. Filling them with the OMS trophies is next step.

Membership STATS

As of 30 Sep 2021, there are 65 Life Members, 36 current dues paying members, 55 members in arrears, and 50 non-paying alumni/former cadets on the rolls, for a total of 206 Spartans. Hence, we have at least 101 active members.

The Onargosy quarterly distribution is sent to 114 members (to include 8 non-paying) and two former faculty with valid email addresses, and is mailed by US Post to 43 duespaying members and two former faculty.

PRESIDENT'S PONDERINGS

It has been 102 years since the first cadets enrolled in BrigGen Bittinger's fledgling military school. OMS successfully operated for 52 years until its last full class of students graduated. That Class of 1971 reached its 50th anniversary this year; unfortunately, no surviving class members traveled to Onarga to celebrate with other attendees, which is interesting.

Our mission is to perpetuate our organization until the day of the "The Last Cadet".

Our challenge is to sustain our Association, maintain its resources, continue to commemorate OMS heritage, and motivate alumni and former cadets to support, participate and/or join as members as they age, and their interest and abilities wane.

OMS INFLUENCE AND LEGACY

JIM MILLER, Faculty `60s, shared a copy of his article, "The Birth, Death, and Resurrection of High School Smallbore; Fifty Years and Counting," published in <u>The Illinois Shooter</u> summer 2021 issue. Jim mentions his time as an OMS biology teacher and part-time rifle team coach, and how the riflery program subsequently evolved in the local public school community. When OMS closed after the 1970-1971 school year, its rifle program and range equipment eventually moved to the Gilman High School after it received its National Rifle Association (NRA) Club-affiliation charter in December 1971. Jim goes on to describe in detail the interesting trials and tribulations to implement a youth marksmanship program within the local area that would foster proper shooting, safety skills, competition and sportsmanship, and instill community pride and respect.
